1a: extending for a considerable distance: As in, It is a *long* way from Belmont Shore to Antibes. **b:** having greater length than usual: As in, Two weeks is a *long* time to be apart from the people you love. **c:** having greater height than usual: As in, Climbing the stairs to bed seemed *long* when he was alone. **d:** having a greater length than desirable or necessary: As in, He wore a *long* face while they were separated. **2a:** extending over a considerable time: As in, They have been together for a *long* time **b:** having a specified duration: As in, Their separation would last 20,160 minutes *long*. **3:** to feel a strong desire or craving especially for something not likely to be attained: As in, They *long* for the day when they will fall into each other's arms. They will gaze into each other's eyes for a *long* time. The passion they'll share will have been *long* over due.
